



Councilors and staff draft proposed ordinance.

Proposed ordinance presented to Council; Council President sends it to Committee.



Committee reviews ordinance and meets with stakeholders in meetings open to the public.

Committee asks Internal Auditor for fiscal analysis of ordinance.



Committee presents amended ordinance to Council; Council votes.

If majority of Council votes to pass ordinance, another vote is taken at the next meeting.



If ordinance is passed by majority twice, it is then sent to Mayor.

The Mayor can:

- Sign ordinance → Ordinance becomes law.
- Do nothing → Ordinance becomes law after 10 days.
- Veto ordinance → Ordinance dies unless a Council super-majority (10 votes) overrides Mayor's veto.
